REPORT OVERVIEW

The recent protests across Iran started on 16 September 2022, following the death of Mahsa (Jina) Amini, who died due to torture in a detention centre in Tehran. Mahsa Amini, a 22-year-old woman, was travelling with her family from the province of Kurdistan to Tehran to visit their relatives. On 13 September, she was taken into custody by the morality police for improper hijab and three days later succumbed to her internal injuries from beatings by government agents. Public outcries and mass protests soon followed and were met with severe government backlash. As part of their program of aggression and violent crackdown, government forces carried out directly targeted attacks against children (persons less than 18 years of age). The main security force of the regime in Iran is the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC). IRGC is the multi-service primary branch of the Armed Forces in Iran. The following is a report of documented abuses and killings of children committed by IRGC, since the death of Mahsa (Jina) Amini. The report and supporting materials provide context and lists of victims, including 76 documented and verified killings, 272 abductions and arrests, examples of specific cases, and examples of targeted attacks on 38 schools.

INTRODUCTION

School children, especially girls under 18 years of age, have been participating in the protests against the Islamic regime in Iran by taking off their hijabs in their schools and on the streets. They also show their protest by tearing off the pictures of the leaders of the Islamic regime from their school books and chanting the revolution's main slogan: Woman, Life, Freedom! This is an affront to the Islamic Republic's regime, and has been met with violence and brutality. The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) has been the main perpetrator of brutalising and killing children in Iran.

The IRGC is the primary armed branch of the Islamic Republic with a mandate to preserve and protect Islamic rule and the Islamic Regime in Iran. The IRGC has an over four decades-long record of violence against children, including arrests, torture, and executions. However, since 16 September 2022, the frequency and types of violence perpetrated against children have been unprecedented. Children have been either directly subjected to, or witnessed, violence and torture on the streets, in their homes, or in prisons. The IRGC security forces have attacked schools and homes, shot and injured hundreds of children, and killed many. Since the start of the protests in September 2022, the IRGC security forces have been directly responsible for killing at least 76 children; two were as young as two and seven years old. **Appendix 1** provides a list of reported and verified cases of children killed by IRGC forces. The list has been verified by the Campaign to Free Political Prisoners in Iran¹ (CFPPI).

THE IRGC IS ABDUCTING, DETAINING, AND TORTURING CHILDREN.

Since the start of the protests, hundreds of children, including students, have been abducted and tortured². According to Hengaw, a reputable human rights organization³, during the first week of December 2022, alone, at least 300 students from various cities of the province of Kurdistan were abducted. CFPPI has verified information about 3267 detainees and estimated that approximately 10% are under 18 years of age. Please see **Appendix 2** for CFPPI findings.

These children have been abducted from their homes, their schools, on the streets, and during the protests. They have been subjected to psychological and physical torture, including rape. Some children were given the death sentence. Some of these children have been forced into a false confession. Their families have been threatened and pressured not to publicise their children's names and situations. Many families are not informed of the whereabouts of their children. Most families approached by CFPPI for interviews have stated they are under pressure and threatened by the IRGC. IRGC agents threaten families not to speak out. Otherwise, they will not be permitted to see their children, they may "never" see their children again, other family members will be arrested, or they are told to keep quiet so their children may be released sooner. In a majority of cases, families are asked for bail money. The families either cannot afford to pay the bail money or have to borrow the bail money. In both cases, the families of arrested children are under immense financial pressure.

THE IRGC FORCES ARE BEATING CHILDREN TO DEATH.

At least 76 children have been killed at the hands of IRG forces, from beatings during the protests or torture while in custody. Following their deaths, the Islamic Regime claimed that these children have committed suicide stemming from mental health problems, heart attacks due to a preexisting heart condition, or other illnesses which their families have confirmed was untrue. The IRGC agents have threatened the children's families not to disclose the manner and state in which their children died. The funeral ceremonies have been held under the heavy presence and surveillance of the security forces. Moreover, multiple reports indicate that IRGC forces have stolen the bodies of their victims and denied their families the right to bury their children or take photographic records of the condition of the bodies.

Similar to many other cases, 16-year-old Nika Shakarami's tortured body was stolen by IRGC and buried in a village. The regime's forces tried to use this as leverage over Nika's family to force them to say Nika had committed suicide. Nika's aunt and uncle were arrested on 2 October 2022 after publicising Nika's death on social media. They were forced into false confessions to say Nika committed suicide. THE IRGC FORCES HAVE SHOT AT CHILDREN ON THE STREETS AND IN THEIR HOMES.

Children have been targeted and intentionally shot at by the IRGC forces in schools, on the streets, and even in their homes. IRGC forces have used pellet guns and deliberately taken aim and shot at children's eyes, causing loss of eyesight and other injuries. To avoid arrests, many children have been treated at home instead of in a hospital. [Appendix 4](#) provides a few examples. These children have been put in grave danger because they are deprived of proper medical treatment. Most of their families have minimal access to first aid supplies. Many families do not want to publicise the situation to protect their children from being arrested. In cases where the families have spoken out about the situation, they do not wish to publish their children's names or pictures of their faces.

THE IRGC FORCES HAVE COMMITTED TARGETED ATTACKS ON SCHOOLS.

At least 38 schools were attacked by IRGC's plainclothes security forces and the Basiji⁴ militia over five weeks, from 24 September 2022 to 4 November 2022. A list of 38 schools that have come under attack is provided in [Appendix 5](#). Reports have shown students were brutally attacked in schools, and as a result many have been injured and traumatised; some were taken into custody by security forces. One such example is the case of Asra Panahi age 15. The IRGC's plainclothes agents raided her school (Shahed Girls High School) in the city of Ardebil on 12 October 2022. The reason for the raid was that the school girls did not want to take part in the government-ordered ceremony to sing the "Hello Commander" anthem. The IRGC forces beat up the school children. Consequently, at least 12 students were sent to a local hospital. Asra Panahi was beaten so brutally that she died in the hospital, see [Appendix 3](#).

THE ISLAMIC REGIME IS SENDING CHILDREN TO A "REFORMING" PROGRAM.

On 11 October 2022, the Islamic regime's Education Minister, Yousef Nouri, announced that the detained young students are sent to "psychological centres" to be reformed prior to their release. The "psychological centres" and their so-called "reforming" program are centres for psychological tortures perpetrated against young students. Their psychological torture programs are likely highly traumatic and may cause significant short-term and long-term psychological impacts on their victims and their families. In response to these cases, 87 psychotherapists and psychologists from across the United Kingdom have written a letter to the UK government and psychological organizations, asking them to pressure the Islamic Republic of Iran to release the students they are subjecting to psychological torture. THE ISLAMIC REGIME'S VIOLENCE WILL HAVE PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPACTS ON CHILDREN.

The children whose cases are reported here, and many others, have been punished violently and brutally only because they were practising what should be their basic right to freedom of expression. The IRGC forces have subjected the children abducted during protests to physical, psychological, and sexual torture, including rape. According to their families, these children present with symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), including flashbacks, nightmares, suicidal thoughts or attempts, anxiety, self-isolation, lack of concentration, low mood, and panic. Other symptoms reported include frequent crying, withdrawing from school and activities, and not communicating with their friends and family members.

The children whose eyes were targeted with pellet guns have experienced severe physical pain, loss of sight, and other clinical complications. These children doubly suffer from psychological problems, loss of any sense of safety and trust in how they experience the world around them, and loss of identity from someone with complete vision to someone with permanently compromised vision. Their suffering culminates in feelings of loss, anger, powerlessness, and helplessness, which may impact their development.

In the case of all the children attending the schools that have been attacked, their sense of trust and safety has been overwhelmingly compromised, whether or not they have been directly harmed. Schools are supposed to protect children. Yet, these schools have become the targets of attacks, and many students, friends, and classmates have suffered threats, physical abuse, and psychological torture. The IRGC's forces have transformed schools into centres of powerlessness and fear. The IRGC forces have succeeded in their attacks partly because they have collaborators among the heads of schools and teachers, while other school faculty and staff are powerless to help their pupils. Students are aware of the situation and are rightly fearful of more school attacks.

Although the impacts of PTSD could be addressed with extensive psychotherapy, these children are typically re-traumatized because the violent situation in Iran persists. Their families fear seeking psychological treatment because they cannot risk being exposed and arrested. Moreover, many families cannot afford safe and effective psychological treatment. Therefore, the effects of PTSD could be long-term and if not addressed will impact the children's future adult lives physically, psychologically, and socially.

THOUSANDS OF SCHOOLGIRLS ARE CHEMICALLY POISONED AT SCHOOLS.

On 30 November 2022, a girls' high school in the city of Qom became the first in a series of deliberate chemical attacks on girls' schools in Iran. Chemical attacks on schools have rapidly increased⁵. Since 30 November, more than 250 girls' schools have been attacked and at least 4000 students were poisoned. Students report suddenly being overcome by a sour odour, smell of rotten tangerine, or strong perfume. The reported symptoms includes: fainting, dizziness, headaches, nausea, coughing, breathing difficulties, heart palpitations, muscle weakness, and burning eyes. On 26 February 2023, in the city of Qom, another attack on a girls' school claimed the life of Fatemeh Rezaee, 11 years old. Another student, Karo Peshabadi, age 16, died from poisoning following a chemical attack on his school in Tehran. Karo was hospitalized and died on 7 April 2023. The chemical attacks have been ongoing. In March and April 2023, there were new attacks in several cities across Iran, including Tehran, Karaj, and cities in the provinces of West Azerbaijan, Kurdistan, and Khuzestan.

School girls have actively participated and played an important role in the mass protests and the *Woman, Life, Freedom* revolution. The public in Iran recognizes the chemical attacks as revenge attacks and terrorism to punish girls and students for their central role in the protests, to create widespread fear in society, and repress any further dissent and protests.

THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN IS VIOLATING THE UN CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD (UNCRC).

The Islamic Republic in Iran is a signatory to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Children (UNCRC). The Convention's signatories are committed to protecting children's lives and ensuring the freedom of the beliefs and expressions of children. The government of Iran unapologetically continues to destroy the lives of children. The Islamic regime is in violation of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, including the right to freedom of expression (Article 13) and the right to be safe from violence (Article 19). Therefore:

- ➔ The Islamic Republic of Iran must be held accountable by UNICEF, the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child, the UNHRC Independent International Fact-Finding Mission on Iran, the European Union, and the European Parliament for killing and torturing hundreds of children in Iran, particularly since 16 September 2022.
- ➔ The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) is the perpetrator of the crimes described in this report. The European Council, European governments, and the government of Canada, Australia, and New Zealand must designate the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) as a terrorist group.
- ➔ The United Nations Human Rights Council must take further steps to investigate the findings in this report.
- ➔ The International Criminal Court must take steps to open an investigative mechanism into the regime's treatment and abuse of children and take the necessary steps to investigate the treatment of children by the regime in Iran.
- ➔ UNICEF must take concrete steps to establish and conduct a fact-finding mission into ensuring the safety of children and take onboard the findings in the report.

OPEN LETTER FROM 87 PSYCHOTHERAPISTS AND PSYCHOLOGISTS IN THE UK TO:

THE UK GOVERNMENT, UKCP, BACP, BABCP, BPS, ANNA FREUD CENTRE, EMDR ASSOCIATION, AND INSTITUTE OF PSYCHOANALYSIS

During the recent waves of demonstrations across Iran which started following the death of Mahsa Amini, a 22 years old woman over the Hijab rules, the Islamic Republic in Iran has started arresting thousands of women and men across Iran. The regime has also started to attack schools; arrest young students in their schools, streets, and even their homes; and send young students to prison. Some have been tortured and killed. According to [Amnesty International](#), at least 23 children have been killed by security forces in the recent protests.

The Islamic Republic's Education Minister in Iran, Yousef Nouri, has announced that these young students are sent to a forced "reforming" program before being released from prison and allowed to return to their homes and schools. What is labelled as a "reforming" program is nothing but psychological torture on a large scale perpetrated on these young students. This psychological torture is highly traumatic and likely to have significant short-term and long-term psychological impacts.

Background information:

The demonstrations in Iran continue. The demonstrators, taking their lead from women, have continued to fundamentally challenge the Islamic Republic with its misogynistic, theocratic, oppressive and dictatorial iron fist, which has governed through imprisonment, torture and executions for 43 years. The Islamic Republic's guards have a proven track record of utmost brutality and violent attacks on demonstrators, including children. Arresting and sending young students to a "reforming" program, as a condition of release, is part of a wider violent and brutal crackdown on demonstrators across Iran.

We, the undersigned:

- Urge the UK government to take immediate action and use its power to pressure the government in Iran. The UK government should demand that this "reforming" program, by the regime in Iran, be stopped and all detained students be released immediately and unconditionally.
- Urge UKCP, BACP, BPC, BABCP, BPS and other counselling and psychotherapy organisations to endorse the above demand.
