Joint Statement on the second anniversary of Woman, Life, Freedom movement

On the second anniversary of the Woman, Life, Freedom movement, started by women-led protests against the brutal murder of Mahsa Zhina Amini by the Islamic Regime's Morality Police, we reaffirm our commitment to this cause. In response to the ongoing protests and strikes occurring across the streets and within the prisons of Iran, and in defiance of the regime's continued executions, we once again pledge to persist in this struggle until victory is achieved.

We, the activists and advocates of this movement from around the world, have spent the past year networking, brainstorming, and uniting our efforts. As a result of this collective endeavor, we have paved the way for advancing the three key pillars of the movement's social contract. These are embodied in three broad popular alliances: "Women", represented by the United Against Gender Apartheid; "Life", reflected in the Global Campaign to Stop Executions in Iran; and "Freedom", symbolized by the Global Network to Free Political Prisoners in Iran.

On the second anniversary of the Woman, Life, Freedom revolutionary movement, we, activists, organizations, groups, campaigns, and networks, stand united in calling for the following:

- 1- Mere symbolic condemnation of the ongoing and systematic human rights violations in Iran by the United Nations and the European Parliament is insufficient. We urge both bodies to expedite the implementation of decisive and effective deterrent measures against the regime's human rights abuses.
- 2- We call on international judicial bodies to initiate criminal investigations into the crimes committed by officials of the Islamic regime, particularly the Supreme Leader and the Attorney General, based on international legal principles and accountability mechanisms. We further urge the imposition of international sanctions against these individuals and demand strict enforcement and monitoring of these sanctions against the Islamic Republic.
- 3- We urge governments that are committed to human rights to implement meaningful and effective political boycotts. They should also pursue legal action against the Islamic regime's international money laundering, espionage, and propaganda networks, as well as the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and its global assets. Additionally, we call for a ban on the sale of tools used for repression, torture, and censorship to the regime.
- 4- We urge governments dedicated to human rights to prevent the release of Iranian financial assets currently utilized by the Islamic regime for domestic repression and international terrorism. These resources rightfully belong to the Iranian people and should

instead be allocated to support their demands for freedom and sustainable democracy in Iran.

- 5- We call on governments committed to human rights to incorporate clauses in international agreements with the Islamic regime that the pre-condition for any negotiation must be adherence to human rights standards in Iran.
- 6- We call on civil and political activists worldwide to support Iranian civil activists and advocacy campaigns in establishing local advocacy hubs. These hubs should focus on addressing the criminalization of gender apartheid, the violation of the right to life through the death penalty, and the suppression of freedom of thought and expression through political crimes and imprisonment.

In conclusion, we, the signatories of this statement, United Against Gender Apartheid, Global Campaign to Stop Executions in Iran and the Global Network to Free Political Prisoners in Iran, call on all defenders of liberty, human rights activists, and the international community to stand in solidarity with the people of Iran in this pivotal struggle for human rights and freedom. This moment is more critical than ever for global unity and support for the fundamental rights of the Iranian people. We are unwavering in our commitment to continue this journey until freedom, justice, and democracy are achieved in Iran. We declare to the world that this movement is irreversible, and we will not rest until we achieve final victory.
